

The BC Wildlife Park was first established in 1965, and for the past 53 years we have been promoting our motto “Conservation through Education”. Virtual Education Program

The BC Wildlife Park is now offering select programs to be taught virtually. Each program is redesigned to be taught through online education tools, totaling 40 minutes including an animal encounter and slideshow.

We are also offering virtual animal encounters, a virtual animal experience without programming that is 15 minutes.

Virtual Programs are \$60.00 and Virtual Encounters are \$40.00.



EDUCATION PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

Virtual Programs

All virtual programs are 40 minutes in length.

THE BRAVE LITTLE BURROWING OWL – GRADES K & 1

Discover the lives of burrowing owls through interactive story time! Meet a burrowing owl up close, learn how they survive in their grassland habitat and how we can help this endangered species!

TURTLE TALES – GRADES K & 1

Discover the lives of turtles through interactive story time and art! Meet a turtle up close while learning about what painted turtles need to survive and how they are affected by the invasive red-eared slider!

WISE ABOUT WATER – GRADE 2

Every living thing needs water to survive! Learn about the water cycle and how to keep our water bodies clean for us and the creatures that live there! See a snake and a turtle up close and learn about how they depend on water for survival!

WILDLIFE CYCLES – GRADE 2

Learn about the life cycles of owls and snakes! Did you know that not all snakes lay eggs and that birds are full grown in only a few months? See an owl and a snake up close!

ANIMALS IN THEIR ENVIRONMENT – GRADE 3

Learn how animals interact in their habitat and how everything is connected! This program focuses on food chains and the important links among species in their habitats. See two animals up close and learn where they fit on the food chain.

RAPTOR RESEARCHER – OWLS – GRADE 4

Meet a raptor up close and learn how they sense their surroundings! What amazing adaptations do they use to survive? What do raptors have that other birds don't and why are they so successful?

EDUCATION PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

All virtual programs are 40 minutes in length. All upper level programs are changed to include scientific language and required vocabulary based on grade.

THE POLLUTION PROBLEM—GRADE 4, - 8

How is pollution affecting our world? Thinking about pollution on a global scale all the way down to your backyard, and how it affects the animals we know and love.

RAPTOR RESEARCHER—OWLS—GRADE 5 - 12

Meet a raptor up close and learn about their body systems! How are they able to hunt and survive? What do raptors have and do that other birds don't, and what makes them so successful?

ANIMAL ENCOUNTERS

All animal encounters are 20 minutes in length with built in opportunities for questions with the interpreter.
